

There are different kinds of crimes. Some are much more serious than others are. **Felony** crimes are more serious than **misdemeanor** crimes. If you are guilty of a felony, you can be locked up for a much longer time. The maximum time you could be locked up for a misdemeanor crime is 1 year. The maximum time you could be locked up for a felony crime is many years, possibly even until you are an adult.

Some crimes can be either a misdemeanor or felony, depending how bad the behavior was. A fistfight is one example. If you get into a fistfight you could be charged with misdemeanor battery. If you really hurt someone badly in a fistfight, you could be charged with felony battery.

If you have to go to court to defend your case, don't be afraid to talk to your lawyer. There may be a trial where the judge hears both sides of the story and then decides if you are guilty. If the judge decides that you are guilty, and the crime is not very serious, you might get put on probation. Then you would have to be on probation and do what the judge and probation officer say. If the crime is serious or you have been in trouble before, you could be forced to live away from home or even be locked up. Your family can usually visit

you if you cannot live at home for a while. You and your family may even go to counseling together to understand how to improve your behavior.

No matter what, even if you do get into trouble, remember it's never too late to change yourself for the better. Don't ever give up on yourself!
